### **Sixth Form Recruitment**



### **Year 9 Guided Choices**

'Thank you' to all students and parents for the strong response to our Year 9 Guided Choices process which closed last Friday. Over 80% of students have submitted their options form, increasing their chances of securing their courses of choice. Students who have not yet submitted their form run the risk of not securing a place on their chosen courses and must submit their forms as a matter of urgency.

### Palm Sunday and Ash Wednesday

Over half term, we observe Palm Sunday and also Ash Wednesday, a holy day of fasting and prayer that marks the start of Lent. ## **CLASS CHARTS - UPLOADING WORK**


### How to know when work is to be uploaded.

When a teacher sets the remote education for a student, they decide whether the student is required to upload wok that lesson.

For the student, this will be clear when they view the work in the homework part of ClassCharts.

Students go to the Homework Section in Class Charts and sort their work into order by ISSUE DATE.

This ensures that their lesson for the current day come up first, to help them follow their timetable for the day.



When a student chooses a lesson to complete, there will be a message from their teacher.

The message will have an orange button at the bottom, if work is to be uploaded. If there is no orange button then no work can be uploaded.


### **BIG PRIZE DRAW**

### The Pantry at Notre Dame

We realise in these difficulty and very different times that there may be some families who need that little extra support. As a community, Notre Dame would like to offer the service of "The Pantry" to all of our families as we support each other.

The Pantry is a confidential service (foodbank) run by Notre Dame, whereby you can contact Rebecca Wall, our Chaplain, and ask for help with items of shopping, food and toiletries, that you are unable to afford at the moment during these unprecedented times. It may be that you are unable to access benefits, have been made redundant, are working less hours – all making it difficult to feed/support your family as you would normally do.

You may only need to use The Pantry once, or you may need to use it on a more regular basis. Please feel free to call Rebecca and speak to her directly in confidence. You don't even need to share information with your child.
