Notre Dame Catholic College is proud to be celebrating Safer Internet day on Tuesday 9th February 2021.

This year in the UK, Safer Internet Day explores reliability online. The internet has an amazing range of information and opportunities online, but how do we separate fact from fiction?

All students will have the opportunity to explore this theme by completing a remote learning lesson on safer internet day. The following themes will be taught:

Key Stage 3 (Ages 11 - 14) How 'believable' content is on the internet.

Key Stage 4 & 5 (Ages 14 - 18) What is 'fake news'?

Students will also have the opportunity to **customise a Safer Internet Day social media poster. Students** could fill the magnifying glass with their ideas about how we can create **#AnInternetWeTrust**. This could be:

- Questions to ask when you are looking at information online, for example: Who wrote this? Why was it written?
- Words or questions we can ask to help us spot if something is reliable online.
- Illustrations of what a better, more trustworthy internet could look like. Or images of online clues that may make something seem less reliable or trustworthy.
- Pledges of what they will do to help create a more trustworthy internet, such as, "I will only share things I have checked are true" or "I will support my friends if fake news upsets them."





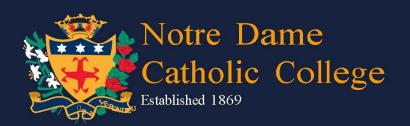
BIG PRIZE DRAW

The Pantry at Notre Dame

We realise in these difficulty and very different times that there may be some families who need that little extra support. As a community, Notre Dame would like to offer the service of "The Pantry" to all of our families as we support each other.

The Pantry is a confidential service (foodbank) run by Notre Dame, whereby you can contact Rebecca Wall, our Chaplain, and ask for help with items of shopping, food and toiletries, that you are unable to afford at the moment during these unprecedented times. It may be that you are unable to access benefits, have been made redundant, are working less hours – all making it difficult to feed/support your family as you would normally do.

You may only need to use The Pantry once, or you may need to use it on a more regular basis. Please feel free to call Rebecca and speak to her directly in confidence. You don't even need to share information with your child.
