
Headteacher's Message


Dear Parents and Carers,



National Citizenship Service



SKI TRIP - YEAR 9 / YEAR 10

Pila – Ski Trip March 2023

I am pleased that your son/daughter would like to take up this exciting opportunity to attend the Ski Trip to Pila in Italy staying at the Miage hotel. The company we are using to arrange this trip is Interski who are ABTA & ATOL protected. The visit to Pila in Italy will take place from Sunday 5th March until Saturday 11th March 2023. Flights and times will be available once we have paid the deposits and will be passed on as soon as we have confirmation.

The cost of this amazing opportunity is a total of £1220 which includes coach to and from the airport, flights, transport, food, accommodation, five days of skiing including lift passes, insurance, ski equipment, specialised clothing (e.g. ski jacket and salopettes), coaching sessions and evening activities. Some smaller pieces of equipment such as ski goggles and warm clothing will need to be supplied separately (this list will be made available at a later date).

This visit will give students the opportunity to participate in five full days of skiing at the resort. The students will have ski instructors working with small groups of different abilities. We will also hold an information evening in the future to give parents/carers information they will require regarding the trip and to answer any questions.

The initial cost for this trip would be a non-refundable deposit of £250 which needs to be paid via the parent pay app and then monthly payments thereafter. In order to make this as affordable as possible we will split the costs up and the payment dates are as follows, unless you wish to make the payment in full:

3rd installment of £250 by 15th July 2022

4 th installment of £250 by 30 th September 2022	5 th installment of £220 by 30 th November 2022

Frequently asked questions

- 1. **Does my child need a passport?** Yes, we will be flying into another Country. Passports must have at least 6 months left on the pass port prior to flying out on the trip.
- 2. Does my child require a visa? No, you do not require a visa to travel to Italy for less than 90 days.
- 3. **Does my child need to pay for meals during the trip?** No, all meals are provided. The hotel provides half board which includes breakfast and evening meal. Whilst out on the slopes the students will be provided with a hot meal for their lunch. Food is also included during the travel to and from Italy however, students may wish to take some cash to buy snacks whilst at the airport.
- 4. **Do I need to by ski equipment for my child?** Hire of skis, ski boots, salopettes, ski jacket and helmet are provided as part of the cost.
- 5. **Do I need to by any other ski accessories for my child?** You will need to provide ski goggles (you can get these from £8.99 from Decathlon/ Amazon and other shops), water proof gloves, ski mask (optional), thermals (optional) & high factor sun cream which can be found for reasonable prices from various shops, otherwise provide suitable warm clothing. Optional extras snow boots but shoes with thick-ish soles e.g. trainers or walking shoes if they already have them are fine to wear (this is just to keep feet warm whilst walking from the hotel to the slopes).
- 6. Does my child need to take money with them whilst they are away? It would be suggested that students take some spending money as there will be opportunities to buy items and snacks from shops. We will have a better idea closer to the time as to a suggested amount to take.
- 7. **Do I need to take my child to the airport?** No, there will be transport provided from school and return to school.
- 8. What does the day look like during the trip? They will get 5 hours of skiing per day and we will have a clearer idea of the itinerary e.g. times and evening activities when we have more details when the booking is confirmed.
- 9. Do they need to have skied before? No, they will be separated into groups of similar abilities.
- 10. Will they need to attend sessions prior to the trip? No, however we will give students the opportunity to attend a session at Chill Factore closer to the visit if they wish to have an introduction to skiing.
- 11. Who will my child be going with? At all times the students will be closely supervised by teaching staff. During the skiing sessions both ski instructors and staff on the course, all of whom are experienced in assisting in residential visits of this nature and there will always be a first aider available.
- 12. Cost of this trip? The cost of this trip is always a major concern and you will understand that skiing is not a cheap activity. Particularly when you have to pay for lift pass, ski lessons as well as flights and accommodation including food. However, such a trip is a memorable trip that a student can have.
- 13. Students behavior? I am sure you will appreciate that students will be taken on the understanding that student behavior prior to the trip is exemplary to comply with the risk assessment guidelines. It is not possible to take students who present a risk to themselves, other students or staff. We therefore reserve the right to bar from the trip students whose behavior we deem unacceptable. In these exceptional circumstances' monies paid to the company will be non-refundable.

Does my child need to be vaccinated against covid? This maybe a possibility depending on government guidelines at the time of travel.

- 14 Does my child need to be vaccinated against covid? This maybe a possibility depending on government guidelines at the time of travel.
- 15What happens if one or more members test positive for covid or need to self-isolate? They are covered for the cancellation of their place on the trip as part of the insurance policy and we can make a claim for re-imbursement.
- 16 Do I need to quarantine or take a covid test? This will depend on the current rules at the time of departure. We do not expect this to be the case due to current rules. We agree to follow government travel advise at the time of the visit.
- 17 What else do I need to do? You will need to apply for a GHIC card (European Health Card) This card is free and provides medical necessary state-provided healthcare that cannot reasonably wait until you come back to the UK.
- 18 What if my child has special dietary needs? We will need to be made aware of any special requirements early on so that we can discuss and pass on relevant information to the necessary people.
- 19 What if my child has a medical condition? This is best to be discussed with the school on an individual basis prior to paying any deposits.
