Punctuality - Why is it Important?

For students to be successful it is vital that they maximise their learning time. This means being on time to school and every lesson. Good punctuality provides the following benefits:

- 1. It shows your integrity and Courtesy
- 2. You will be seen as dependable
- 3. It will build your self-confidence
- 4. It sharpens your discipline
- 5. Route to Success



To support students and help them maintain good punctuality we reward them with Class Charts points when they get it right and we have the following detention system:

Staged Approach	Who will the detention be with?	Length of detention
Stage 1 – Form teacher Detention	10 for late to school and 5-minute detention for every late to lesson, with form tutors , the same day.	10 mins for late to school 5 mins for every late to lesson (Maximum of 35 minutes if also late to school and all 5 lessons).
Stage 2 –Detention	Failure to attend stage 1 detention will result in an upscaled Stage Two detention the following night.	1 hour
