

Medical Appointments

With this in mind, we would like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers of the College's procedure for students who have medical appointments.

- 1. On the day of the appointment, students must show either an appointment letter or a parent note (on paper or in their planner) to our Student Services desk during Form Time.
- 2. Our Student Services Team will issue your child with a pink slip that looks like the image below.
- 3. When your child needs to leave school, they show their pink slip to their classroom teacher and report to main reception where they will be signed out of school.

The College's Tannoy system is intended to be used for emergencies only, not to call students down for routine medical appointments, as Tannoy announcements can unnecessarily interrupt learning in classrooms.

Auschwitz Visit

On Wednesday 9th November 4 of our Sixth Form Students took part in an educational visit to Poland alongside History Teacher, Mr Bond to visit Auschwitz, Birkenhau. Year 12 students, Maggie and Leah were joined by Year 13 Head students Paul and Louis. Louis shared the following experience of their trip:

"On Wednesday we spent the day at Auschwitz I and Auschwitz 2, also known as Auschwitz Birkenhau. The day was full of learning about the hardships that the Jewish people had to endure under Nazi occupation and how they tried to survive in those inhumane camps. Before we visited the concentration camps, we firstly visited Osweicim. We visited this town because this was where the Jewish community lived before they were deported to Auschwitz and we learnt about how they loved and how the Jewish people of Osweicim had a thriving community before the Nazi invasion. After the visit to Osweicim, we then travelled to Auschwitz 1. We had a tour guide showing us and explaining to us th3 tragedies the Jewish people had to live through. Furthermore, when walking through the exhibits looking at all of the belongings of the Jewish people it really showed the depth of destruction that was caused. When walking through the exhibit of human hair you experience a feeling that is indescribable.

Finally, we visited Auschwitz, Birkenhau and upon going through the gates at Birkenhau you were hit with this overwhelming sense of loss and destruction. During our visit we looked at how the Jewsih people lived and how their lives were taken away and once we finished the tour of Birkenhau we had a ceremony for those who died and this was an experience I will never forget."


Year 10 Leadership Event - Athletics
