
LFC Charity Legends Match

Shaping Futures partnered with The Pay Index to give every school in the Liverpool City Region the latest Labour Market Information.

This salary comparison tool allows users to view expected salaries in various professions, regional differences and the gender pay gap in each industry. It also gives an insight into expected salary differences depending on qualifications and opportunities for progression.

Please complete your child's consent form <u>even if you DO NOT</u> want your child to receive this vaccination, this will avoid you receiving further follow up correspondence from our service and assist with campaign delivery.

If you wish to change your decision at any time after submitting your form, you must contact the immunisation service.

The Easter HAF programme starts on the 3rd April and there are lots of great activities happening over the school holidays. Children and young people will be able to access hundreds of activities throughout the Easter break including specific provision available for children with SEND or additional needs, at no cost to you. There's a great range of activities across the city including boxing, trampolining, football, music, dance, cycling, cooking, climbing, films, bowling, arts and crafts, drama, a make up course, trips out, Eurovision themed activities and much more! Every day there will be a meal available for every child that attends.

When you have chosen an activity, you will need to contact that organisation to book a place. Each organisation will have either a telephone number, email address or online booking system. If your child has any additional needs or dietary requirements then please discuss this with the organisation when you book. There is no central booking system so please read the details of the programmes on the website and ring the providers directly.

Liverpool City Council is working with the local schools, voluntary and community organisations, and childcare providers to provide the HAF programme. The programme is funded by the Department for Education.

Dear Parents/Guardians.

- 8ohool Keep Clear Zig Zags

- Near School Crossing Patrol locations
- On Pavements
- Cvole Lanes
- In front of resident driveways.

Do's...

Do check the tutors qualifications

Do undertake background checks, including reference from last employer

Do speak to other parents who provide recommendations

Do ensure the sessions take place at your home and are visible to you

Do make sure you and your child feel comfortable with the tutor

Do challenge any practice you feel is inappropriate or harmful

Do make sure any communication from the tutor goes through you and not your child

Do do maintain boundaries - tutors are professionals you are paying for a service

Don't assume the tutor has had background checks Don't ignore if your child says they are not happy with the tutor

Don't leave your child alone with tutors whilst you are out / not around

 $\mathsf{n}'\mathsf{t}$ accept the tutor's word; ask to see evidence of qualifications

Don't allow your child and tutor to have each others their personal number / email / social media

Don't allow your child to meet the tutor outside of sessions

Don't accept practice or behaviour from the tutor that you feel is harmful, unsafe or unprofessional

Don't accept that a DBS check means someone is safe to work with children, if something does not feel right you should check or report:

- Communicate with your child
- Share information with the Local Authority Designated officer (LADO)
- Report concerns to the police
