Misuse of College Toilets

Here at Notre Dame, we take great pride in the care with which we treat our shared environment and facilities. On the whole, students are fully appreciative of just how fortunate we are to have such an amazing, state-of-the-art home in which to learn and work. Disappointingly, in recent weeks we have witnessed an increase in the misuse and vandalism of student toilets, by both genders. Not only does such vandalism cost the college precious time and money that we would much prefer to direct towards the enhancement of your child's education, the numerous repairs required force us to close toilets whilst this work is undertaken, thus depriving well-intentioned students of the use of these toilets.

We are asking parents to support the college in reinforcing the basic expectations of how to use our communal toilets respectfully and support college staff in ensuring the following:

- As always, students are encouraged to use the toilet <u>before or after the school day, at break</u> time <u>or lunch time</u>.
- Any student who needs to go to the toilet during a lesson, must get the express <u>permission of their class teacher</u> in the form of a written note or yellow lanyard.
- No more than one student will be allowed to leave a classroom to go to the toilet at any one time
- Students are not allowed to go to the toilet during the first or last ten minutes of each lesson unless they are medically exempt.

Working together on this shared understanding of our rules and our shared commitment to respectful use of our shared facilities, will prevent college leaders from having to take some of the more drastic steps being taken in other schools across the country. Careers News this week...

Opening Minds and Doors at Oxford!

Our Careers Advisor, Mrs Hall, has taken 5 of our Year 12 students on a residential trip to St Peter's College at Oxford University organised by Aspire, Liverpool. Aspire is an organisation that helps to open doors to the countries top Universities to enable Liverpool students to maximise their potential.



A total of 82 students from secondary schools and college's across Liverpool have attended the trip which will give them a direct insight into what student life at Oxford University is like and to take part in real-life lectures and seminars.







So far, our students have had the opportunity to attend talks held by top Professors at St Peter's College, attend workshops and seminars with their peers and hear from Oxford University graduates who also joined from Liverpool. Students have even had the opportunity to take part in a scavenger hunt to give them the chance to explore the city of Oxford.

Students will be returning to Liverpool on Saturday, and we look forward to hearing all about what they made of the experience upon their return!





Opening Minds to Cambridge

Our Year 10 students had a fantastic opportunity this week to attend an inspirational workshop at Liverpool's Maritime Museum, hosted by the Magdelene College Outreach Team from Cambridge University. The session was led by Dr Sergio Baccalado, Fellow in Mathematics at Magdalene College and Admissions Tutor for their Outreach programme and gave students an insight into studying at Cambridge University and potential routes to Higher Education.



Opening Doors to Careers in Science

On Monday 20th March Year 12 students visited the University of Liverpool. They took part in an interactive session with the Astrophysics Department exploring different types of careers involved in building a new telescope.

Students then had the opportunity to explore product development, visiting Elida Beauty within Liverpool Science Park. There students made shampoo and tested their product in the salon. Students enjoyed a tour around the Materials Innovation Factory, a £38 million facility dedicated to research and development of advanced materials before finally visiting The Spine. There they were introduced to the Royal College of Physicians and toured a mock hospital floor.











Talent Foundry and M&G Investments Workshops

The Talent Foundry, an Education based charity and M&G Investments have been attending Notre Dame Catholic College to deliver fantastic workshops for our students around building skills to **open doors** to future employment opportunities.

OPENING DOORS

Catherine McNeill from The Talent Foundry has been delivering the M&G Investment's Skills for Life workshops with our Year 12 students. These sessions focus on key employability skills to prepare students for the transition from the world of Education to the world of work. The sessions focus on a range of useful topics including how to write an effective C.V and covering letter to Finance topics such as how to apply for student finance, how to manage personal finances or how to read a payslip effectively.

The Skills for Life workshops also explore routes into employment post-Sixth Form, looking at opportunities such as Higher Education based Apprenticeships which are becoming an increasingly popular choice for employers and students as a pathway to their chosen career. Catherine explained this further,

"Higher Education Apprenticeships are a fantastic choice for young people with a clear idea of what career they'd like to pursue as they are able to study and receive their degree for no cost, earning a livable wage, gaining valuable work experience whilst retaining many of the benefits of student life such as access to student accommodation. For that very reason they are highly competitive and sought after by people throughout the UK so you really have to know how to stand out on your application.

Our Skills for Life programme helps to do this by empowering young people with knowledge of what makes for a strong application."



Our Year 12 session this week focused on an 'Assimilated Assessment Task' to recreate the environment students might come across in an assessment centre when applying for an apprenticeship such as this.

The support of the Talent Foundry also gives our students who may have identified SEND needs the knowledge and empowerment to know when and what they are entitled to request in regards to reasonable adjustments at any employment assessments or interviews to ensure they have fair and equal access when seeking employment or higher education opportunities.

A huge thank you to Catherine on the delivery of this programme to help our students grow in confidence when entering the world of work and Higher Education, and to Mrs Hall for organising this support for our students.


Employer Networks - Can you help?

*Please note this is a change of date to the one advertised in last week's newsletter due to rescheduling.




BRAVE = Building Resilience Against Violence and Extremism

Shaping Futures partnered with The Pay Index to give every school in the Liverpool City Region the latest Labour Market Information.

This salary comparison tool allows users to view expected salaries in various professions, regional differences and the gender pay gap in each industry. It also gives an insight into expected salary differences depending on qualifications and opportunities for progression.

The Easter HAF programme starts on the 3rd April and there are lots of great activities happening over the school holidays. Children and young people, who are eligible for benefits related free school meals, will be able to access hundreds of activities throughout the Easter break including specific provision available for children with SEND or additional needs, at no cost to you. There's a great range of activities across the city including boxing, trampolining, football, music, dance, cycling, cooking, climbing, films, bowling, arts and crafts, drama, a make up course, trips out, Eurovision themed activities and much more! Every day there will be a meal available for every child that attends.

To find out where your nearest scheme and all the details of what is on click on this link - https://merseyplay.com/easter-haf-holiday-activities-food/ or visit www.Merseyplay.com and click on the Easter HAF link (available on Friday 10th March).

When you have chosen an activity, you will need to contact that organisation to book a place. Each organisation will have either a telephone number, email address or online booking system. If your child has any additional needs or dietary requirements then please discuss this with the organisation when you book. There is no central booking system so please read the details of the programmes on the website and ring the providers directly. Liverpool City Council is working with the local schools, voluntary and community organisations, and childcare providers to provide the HAF programme. The programme is funded by the Department for Education.
