

# **Examinations and Assessments**

# **Misuse of College Toilets**

As mentioned in our newsletters on 24th and 31st March, we continue to ask parents and carers for your support in upholding our expectations for the appropriate use of college toilets.

- 1. As always, students are encouraged to use the toilet before or after the school day, at break time or lunch time.
- 2. Any student who needs to go to the toilet during a lesson, must get the express permission of their class teacher in the form of a written note or yellow lanyard.
- 3. No more than one student will be allowed to leave a classroom to go to the toilet at any one time
- 4. Students are not allowed to go to the toilet during the first or last ten minutes of each lesson unless they are medically exempt.

The importance of these expectations is compounded by the growing number of students who a vaping both nationally and within our Notre Dame community. This was highlight this week in a <u>BBC article</u> that parents and carers may have seen. It stated that YouGov data for Britain suggests experimental vaping among 11 to 17-year-olds rose from 5.6% in 2014 to 11.6% in 2023.

To support our monitoring of this, we will be improving the coverage of our CCTV system to include the <u>communal areas</u> of student toilets. Please be assured that this will <u>only</u> cover the <u>communal areas</u>, not cubicles and so present no encroachment on personal privacy. It will however, allow us to identify instances of vandalism or when groups of students are entering single individual cubicles which is unhygienic and unsafe. Working together on this shared understanding of our rules and our shared commitment to respectful use of our shared facilities, will prevent college leaders from having to take some of the more drastic steps being taken in other schools across the country. **Thank you, as always, for your support on this.**

Dress code is smart-casual. Suits and prom dresses are not required.



Students partook in activities including the Highland Games, Hungry Hippos, Kinball and Quidditch against various other schools across the city. Well done!








# Year 8 Opening Minds to Computing Opportunities
