Theme of the Week: Example



The theme for this week's collective worship and assemblies has been 'Example'. This was part of a half-termly focus on our **CONFIDENCE** core value. One of the strands of **CONFIDENCE** is the ability to identify and emulate positive and powerful role models in life. This week, we reflected on inspirational stories, such as the life of Glenn Cunningham, who was left unable to walk due to injuries suffered in a fire as a child. Through his own resilience, self-belief and determination, he went on to win an Olympic medal for running in the 1936 Olympics. We drew parallels between Glen's story and that of our Foundress, St Julie, and also reflected on our one true example, Jesus Christ.

Students involved in our Resonate Music Hub's Eurovision projects had their first opportunity to perform this week in the City Centre, for Kind Charles III and the Queen Consort.

Their Majesties attended Liverpool to unveil the Eurovision staging at the M&S Bank Arena and also attended Liverpool Central Library to officially mark the Library's twinning with Ukraine's first public library, the Regional Scientific Library in Odesa.

The pair were greeted at the top of William Brown Street by Resonate's brass band EuroBrass and Liverpool's 100 Voices Choir. Across the two groups their were students representing over 25 different primary and secondary schools, including members of our Notre Dame Catholic College choir, students from St Vincent's School for the Blind and a Ukranian Children's choir.

Lourdes Pilgrimage - Student Reflections

Students, Bonnie, Joe and Tracey reflected on their recent pilgrimage to Lourdes this week with our Chaplain, Miss Wall.

Bonnie shared:

"My time in Lourdes with HCPT was, with no exaggeration, the best experience of my life. My week in Lourdes allowed me to re-explore my faith and discover my connection to my religion once again. The one moment I felt particularly overwhelmed was when mass at the grotto was held, seeing mass held at one of the most important Catholic sites on earth was a once in a lifetime experience, I will never forget.

Being involved in the choir was something we know is likely we can never experience again and I feel so incredibly lucky that we chose to go the year we could be involved with leading the masses. As well, the connections we made with each other was one of the highlights of my year. Not only did it allow space for the friendship between me and my two best friends, Joe, and Tracey, to grow, it allowed us the opportunity to create new friendships. Everyone in group 133 was so warm, welcoming, and amazing. They all treated us with such kindness and immediately welcomed us into their established chosen family."



Joe shared:

"One night, at dinner, Fr Sean told me that whenever I should visit Lourdes, I will come to love Our Lady in a brand-new way. I did not doubt him for a second, so for the whole week I lived in the excitement of a new revelation of my faith. One night, after visiting the chapel of light, our group crossed the river and went to the Grotto for some evening prayer. I went to the closest pew in front of the statue of Our Lady and knelt to say my prayers. When I looked up at her, and she looked down at me, I couldn't help but cry. It was a week following Good Friday, and I thought about her own tears that fell at Calvary. I thought about Bernadette, who so dutifully spread the news of the apparition despite being branded a mad woman. I thought about my grandmother, who made the pilgrimage during her own period of illness before I had been born. It was that night I learned that there was something so incredibly special about Lourdes. That night, when saying my last prayers before going to sleep, I realised that I had come to love Our Lady in a brand-new way, just like how Fr Sean had told me I would."



Tracey shared:

"To go on pilgrimage during one of the most sacred celebrations of the Catholic faith will forever be a defining moment of my life. Lourdes was extremely beautiful from the buildings to the types of people who walked through its gates, and luckily for us, we entered the city with a group of people from Liverpool who were just as excited & eager as us. Not only because we were in the presence of Our Lady but, because Merseyside lead all the masses that week. Bonnie, Joe and I were in the choir with the friends we made that week who played the guitar, the piano or even sang solo. From Mass in the mountains at Gavarnie, singing Rise and Shine repeatedly, singing at the Torchlight Procession or our fancy dress party, it was an incredible week spent with incredible people.

Finally, I'd like to say thank you to the Notre Dame community for helping us fundraise for our pilgrimage, the effort everyone put into helping us is an act of pilgrimage in its self and looking back it's truly amazing how invested everyone has been in getting us there and listening to our endless stories when we got back. Going on pilgrimage with an amazing organisation such as HCPT reaffirms your faith by seeing others put said faith into action. Maybe this will help some of you consider coming along in the years to come."








Confidence Competition

Shortlisted pupils will win £10 One4All vouchers. Competition winners will win £50 One4All vouchers.








Careers News this week...

We are encouraging all students to begin contacting different employers asap to find their own placement. Deadline for self-placements is 17th July. For those students unable to secure their own the placement of their choice, we will ask **Elevate** our work experience partner to provide a work placement for them. To help with the administration of self-placements we will be using the **Unifrog Placements Tool**. As a school we subscribe to Unifrog, an excellent careers management platform that provides great resources for students to support their career planning and personal development. Year 11 Work Experience will take place 11th -15th December 2023.


Owing to the increased demand for work experience placements over the last year, we feel it is essential that our current Year 10 students begin as soon as

We are asking Year 10 students (with their families support) to source their own work experience placement. To manage the administration of self-placements, are using the Uniforg Flacements Tool to collect information from the employer about their flisk Assessment and Health & Safety policy, as well as getting aggreement from PerentSiZers for the placement to go abead. Unling is a comprehensive careers platform that we subscribe to as a school and students will be given the opportunity to subscribe to this platform ouring the Summer 2023 Term.

The deadline for all self-placements is 17th July. If a student is unable to find their own placement, we will work with Elevate, one of our work experience partners, to support finding a placement for them. Please be aware that there is no guarantee this will be in your child's preferred job sector, for further information, please set he resources below.
