Good luck to each of you - we look forward to welcoming you back on Results Day and hearing about what the future has in store!












Year 11 Leavers Assembly - Monday 26th June, 9.15am

This must be given to the school's exams officer. The person you have asked to collect your results will also need to show photographic identification (driving license / passport) to the exams officer along with the letter of permission before we can release them. Please see example of how this should be worded below:

Letter of permission
I (print name), give (print name of person collecting results)
permission to collect my Summer 2023 exam results.
Sign and date your letter.

Further details of times to collect your results will be shared on the school website and via our Parent App / Class Charts Apps closer to the time.

Celebrating Saint Julie Billiart!

On the 22nd June 1969, people from all over the world gathered at the Vatican, Rome, to watch Julie Billiart being canonised a saint.

In celebration to mark 64 years since this event, our students and School Chaplain Miss Wall, took the time to write inspirational quotes from St Julie herself. Our Sixth Form students then kindly distributed these with Tea, Coffee and treats to our teacher's and support staff during Break and Lunch!

Miss Wall also shared cards to remind us of why St Julie was canonised a Saint and highlighting the incredible achievements of our Foundress.





St. Julie Billiart

A saint for our times

On the 22nd June 1969, people from all over the world gathered at the Vatican, Rome, to watch Julie Billiart being canonised a saint.

The celebrations for Julie Billiart were led by Pope Paul VI, who during Mass spoke the following words: "What is the point of celebrating the saints if we do not try to follow their example? Are they not challenging us to dare to do great things? Do they not show us the possibility of the real practice of Christian virtues?"



How did Julie become Saint Julie?

On the 13th May 1906 Pope Pius X announced that Julie had lived a holy life by beatifying her. That meant she became known as Blessed Julie.

But then, there was a 63 year long wait until Blessed Julie became St. Julie. This was because to be proclaimed a saint – two miracles have to be ascribed to you. Those miracles are checked out and the Church tends to move cautiously as this happens.

The first miracle recognised was that of Otacilio Ribeiro from Brazil. After being taken to hospital, doctors found a huge tumour. Ribeiro was told that there was no hope and was given three days to live. One of Ribeiro's nurses was a Sister of Notre Dame. She encouraged Ribeiro to pray and whilst they prayed, she placed a relic (an object, especially a piece of the body or a personal item of someone of religious importance, that was has been carefully preserved) of Blessed Julie on his incision. A week later Ribeiro was cured.

The second miracle is attributed to the healing of Homere Rhodius from Belgium. Rhodius suffered from an incurable disease called uraemia. After Rhodius fell into a coma, a family member placed a relic of Blessed Julie on him whilst she prayed. In less than a month, Rhodius had awoke from the coma and was completely cured.

While the doctors were astonished – the Church investigators took some convincing. In fact, the Belgium case was refused at first but it was re-investigated in 1967 and it was declared a miracle.









iSing Success!

Nearly three thousand children from 44 schools across Liverpool and the surrounding city region (including our own Notre Dame Choir!) were truly United in Music at this year's iSing event organised by Resonate, Liverpool's Music Education Hub.

This year the iSing was supported by Culture Liverpool as a Eurovision legacy event and the children sang some old Eurovision classics as well as singing various songs in different languages from Spanish to Urdu!

The children attended over two days, where they performed on stage at the Liverpool Philharmonic. Even the teachers got involved surprising them with an a Capella performance of Mae Muller's "I wrote a song" arranged by an amazing world record holding bear boxer and rapper Testament. The children also became a huge human beat box under Testament's direction and he helped the children compose their own rap for one of the songs.

A fabulous two days was had by all. Thank you to all who participated!
