HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents and Carers.

Academisation Programme

As parents and carers may or may not be aware, in March 2022, the government published its White Paper, which stated that by 2030, all schools will be expected to become an academy and join a Multi-Academy Trust (MAT). A MAT is a group of schools which work together to share best practice, so that educational standards are raised even further and greater value for money can be secured through joint buying power. MATs receive funding directly from the government, rather than through a Local Authority, and are governed by a Board of Directors.

In communication with our Trustees, the Sister of Notre Dame, and our governing body, the Department for Education (DfE) have informed us that Notre Dame Catholic College will begin the process of becoming an academy through the course of the coming academic year and will join a Catholic MAT. The DfE have not yet decided which Catholic MAT Notre Dame will join but a decision on this is expected over the coming weeks. Parents and carers will be informed once this decision has been communicated to Trustees and governors.



In many respects, the academies that operate within MATs are run in the same way as state schools. Notre Dame will continue to be a **Catholic** college. The day-to-day running of the school stays the same. Academies are inspected by Ofsted. They have to follow the same rules on admissions, special educational needs and exclusions as other state schools. Academies do not charge fees and students sit the same exams. MATs do have more control over some aspects of school life, for example they do not have to follow the national curriculum and can set their own term times. Building works and end of term arrangements



Back in 2019, in response to the increased demand for places at Notre Dame, governors agreed to increase the college's Pupil Admission Number (PAN) from 150 pupils per year group to 180 pupils per year group. Since then, the college's pupil population has grown by over 200 pupils and leaders have taken several steps to accommodate these growing numbers by building extra classrooms within the school building.

This summer sees the final stage of this building work as we create 4 new classrooms to accommodate the intake of our final bigger year group. Initial construction work on this has commenced during weekends. In consultation with our building contractors and governors, we have amended our arrangements for the end of this summer term in the interests of pupils' health and safety.

Students will now end the summer term at 2.20pm on Friday 14th July. This will ensure that all building work will be complete in time for the start of the new academic year on Monday 4th September.

If this change presents any challenges to parents and carers please do not hesitate to get in touch with school. For pupils eligible for Free School Meals, lunch packs covering the 3 final days of the planned term will be available for collection from reception on **Monday 17th July.** Please contact school if you wish to take up on this offer.



Theme of the Week: British Values

Together, we have explored how the British Values of Democracy, Individual Liberty, The Rule of Law, Mutual Respect and Tolerance compliment our Catholic mission and our Core Values as a Notre Dame school. 


Notre Dame Achieves ADHD Friendly School Status!



Childhood Day - keeping children safe


