



Faith in Action Awards

We have had 18 students, from across different year groups, taking part in this year's Faith in Action Award. Faith in Action is a national award which rewards young people's active service to others in their local and wider community. It helps them connect their life and faith in a tangible manner.









Their award level is based on the type of service performed. Students also have to complete a final piece where they are asked to reflect on what they have done and how this has impacted others and helped themselves to develop. We are delighted to have had students receive Pin, Bronze, Silver and Gold Award this year which is fantastic and a real celebration!

Those taking part in the award have been extremely generous with their time and efforts and have been actively serving others by litter picking; creating Christmas cards for agencies in the local area; making bracelets for children in Alder Hey Children's Hospital; volunteering in a local charity shop; donating items to those in need; helping at church; serving others on pilgrimage in Lourdes; planting vegetables; taking part in fundraising activities; choir services and planning and delivering times of prayer and reflection in school etc.



Katie reflects: "Serving people has changed me as I am more aware of problems that people in society face every day without a choice. Overall, I think I have also gained confidence as I have had to speak to different people and try new things. It has also pushed me out of my comfort zone as I have had to do things I wouldn't normally choose to do. I have also developed different skills like public speaking and gardening."








Classroom spotlight - Year 7 RE

When collecting your A Level / GCSE Results, please note that if you are unable to collect your results in person, you will need to write a letter of permission for the person collecting them on your behalf. This must be given to the school's exams officer. The person you have asked to collect your results will also need to show photographic identification (driving license / passport) to the exams officer along with the letter of permission before we can release them.

Further details of times to collect your results will be shared on the school website and via our Parent App / Class Charts Apps closer to the time.

Free School Meal Summer Vouchers

Liverpool City Council have provided another round of Asda Vouchers worth £90 for all pupils in Years 7-10 eligible for Free School Meals.

All eligible pupils will receive an **email via their preferred contact email address** which will include an **individual unique link**. Please follow the instructions, then you can choose to either print the voucher or keep them on your phone and scan it when you pay. If the link is not clickable on your device you can copy and paste it into a browser on your phone to access the voucher. Please ensure your email mailbox is not full or the email may fail to deliver and remember to check your junk/spam folder. If you are expecting to receive an email and have not please contact the school in the first instance.

Unfortunately, as each voucher is individual, and due to the large number of vouchers to distribute, Notre Dame are unable to print these for you. Liverpool City Council would like us to make it clear there are no replacement or additional vouchers available. If there are any further vouchers provided in the future, then this is the method that the City Council have chosen to distribute them by.
