Behaviour Focus this week: Punctuality

We'd like to thank all Parents and Carers in their support ensuring their child arrives to school ready to learn with the correct uniform and equipment this week. Please can you continue to encourage your child to maintain these standards.

This week, we will be focussing on students **punctuality to school and lessons** as it is becoming an area for concern. We recorded 232 incidents of late arrival to school this week which is simply unacceptable. **Can we remind all parents that the school day starts at 8.45am.** Arrival after this time will result in your child being late which results in an automatic 30 minute detention. Please remind students if they're late to lesson each results in a 5 minute detention up to 25 minutes. If a student has a reasonable excuse for being late please contact our school office. Thank you for your support in this matter.




Parent Pay Support

Notre Dame Catholic College operates a cashless system so all lunches and trips should be paid through the Parent Pay. **Parent Pay is a website and you can access this through google or your default web browser**. **Please note, Parent Pay is not accessed via an app**.

Students can check their allowance via the machines located opposite student services. The machines are simple to use and students simply place their finger on the scanner to see their balance. Please note, students in receipt of Free School Meals will not receive their lunchtime allowance until after breaktime.

If you require your Parent Pay account details, please contact the School Office. Parent Pay also have a 'Knowledge Centre' dedicated to Parents which can be found here.







Getting Creative in Design Technology!



Flu Vaccination Consent Forms

The Liverpool Immunisation Team will be in school on Tuesday 3rd October to deliver Flu Vaccinations to students in Year 7-Year 11. This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help to protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

You can complete the consent form for your child online. Please ensure you complete this form, even if you **don't want them** to receive their flu spray as this will avoid further communications from the immunisation service. Our Apps Explained

For any new parents who have joined our Notre Dame family this week, see the information below regarding the three apps school uses to communicate to parents and students and they ways in which they are used.

Parent App

ParentApp is the school's main source of communication to Parents and is used to inform you of key updates, news and events at the school. You will receive ParentApp updates via the app as a notification, as an email and in certain instances as SMS text messages to your phone.

To access ParentApp and create your account, you will need to respond to the invitation email/text message you receive from us. To enable us to invite you we must have your current and accurate email address and/or telephone number to send you the link.

Class Charts

Class Charts is used to record your child's behaviour at school. Your child will receive points from their teachers to record positive behaviour and address any negative behaviour, including detention details. It is also used by your child's teachers inform you and your child of any important announcements throughout their school day/week. If your child is new, they will have received their code to set up their own Class Charts account and should have received a Parents code for you to be able to access the account and track their progress.



Parent Pay

Parent Pay is a website and accessed via your web browser (e.g. Google) and allows you to place money on to your child's account to allow them to pay for school dinners and trips. For all new students, we will be sending out a letter directly to parents/guardians this week to allow you to create your child's Parent Pay account. In the meantime, your child will be able to add money manually to enable them to purchase any items from the school canteen.

If you are a new parent and have not yet received an invitation to join Parent App, please ensure you've supplied your correct email address and / or telephone number. We will be sending out invites again next week.



Safeguarding Message: Operation Encompass

Notre Dame Catholic College works with the police in Operation Encompass. Further information can be found here. This means that when there is an incident of domestic abuse in the family home the police share the information with a key adult in school.

This information allows school staff to offer immediate support to any pupils who have experienced or witnessed domestic abuse.

Children are negatively impacted by experiencing domestic abuse and without early intervention and support this negative impact can last through a child's life course.

Domestic abuse can impact upon social, psychological, physical, emotional and behavioural outcomes with an often negative impact upon a child's academic success. Experiencing domestic abuse has been identified as an Adverse Childhood Experience. More information can be found on our <u>Safeguarding Padlet here</u>.

Statutory definition of domestic abuse



There is now a statutory definition of domestic abuse covered in the Domestic Abuse Act 2021. Behaviour of a person towards another person is "domestic abuse" in the following circumstance:

The two people are each aged 16 or over and are **personally** connected to each other, and the behaviour is abusive.

Behaviour is "abusive" if it consists of any of the following:

- a) physical or sexual abuse;
- b) violent or threatening behaviour;
- c) controlling or coercive behaviour;
- d) economic abuse;
- e) psychological, emotional or other abuse;

Domestic abuse and children

In the Domestic Abuse Act 2021, children are now recognised as victims of domestic abuse in their own right. A child is regarded as a victim of domestic abuse in the following circumstances:

- · Where a child sees or hears the abuse.
- Experiences the effects of domestic abuse.
- · Is related to the person being abused or the perpetrator.

This is a tremendous move forward in the safeguarding of children who experience domestic abuse but also has implications for all professionals who work with children.



Domestic Abuse Act 2021 definitions

In detail, any reference in the Act to a victim of domestic abuse, includes a reference to a child in any of the following situations:

- a) sees or hears, or experiences the effects of, the abuse, and
- b) is related to either the adult victim or the perpetrator.

A child is related to the adult victim or the perpetrator if:

- a) the person is a parent of, or has parental responsibility for, the child, or
- b) the child and the person are relatives.

In this section:

"child" means a person under the age of 18 years;

"parental responsibility" has the same meaning as in the Children Act 1989.

"relative" has the meaning given by section 63(1) of the Family Law Act 1996.







Dear Parent/Carer.

Our school is part of Operation Encompass which is a national scheme that operates jointly between schools and police forces.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to the start of the next school day, when a child or young person has experienced domestic abuse.

As a school we have ensured that a member of our staff, (Designated Safeguarding Lead) known as a Key Adult, has been trained in the Operation Encompass procedures allowing us to then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to support the child/ren in our care.

The Domestic Abuse Act 2021 identifies children who experience domestic abuse as victims of domestic abuse in their own right.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
