Behaviour Focus this week: Punctuality

We'd like to thank all Parents and Carers for their continued support ensuring their child arrives to school on time and ready to learn with the correct uniform and equipment. Please can you continue to encourage your child to maintain these standards.

This week, we will be continuing to focus on students **punctuality to school, in particular to lessons** as it is becoming an area for concern. We ask Parents and Carers to please remind students if they're late to lesson each results in a **5 minute detention up to 25 minutes**. Students should not be leaving lessons to go to the toilet unless they have a toilet pass. We will continue to update Year 11 Parents and Carers as more revision sessions in other subjects begin.






Student Council leading Student Voice in celebration of International Democracy!

The students had a great experience building key life skills and are super excited for next week!








Skills for living...



Flu Vaccination Consent Forms

The Liverpool Immunisation Team will be in school on **Tuesday 3rd October** to deliver Flu Vaccinations to students in Year 7-Year 11. This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help to protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

You can complete the consent form for your child online. Please ensure you complete this form, even if you **don't want them** to receive their flu spray as this will avoid further communications from the immunisation service.
