## **Behaviour Focus - Maintaining High Standards**

We began the start of this Half Term with Mrs Brennan delivering a series of Year group assemblies focussing on our high standards and expectations of behaviour for all students. Students were reminded of our Core Values of Charity, Courtesy, Confidence and Courage, and how they should be reflected in all aspects of our behaviour whilst at school, or representing our school in the local community.

Parents and Carers are reminded to ensure our uniform guidance and expectations are upheld. Students are expected to attend in full school uniform. Outdoor coats are not permitted to be worn inside the school building and shoes must be plain black, patent or polishable. Trainers are not acceptable including brands such as OnCloud or Nike. You can view our full uniform guidance on our website, including our PE Kit requirements.



We would also like to remind students and parents that we operate a <u>zero tolerance policy on mobile phones</u>. Mobile phones **should not be used inside the school building** and will be confiscated if seen and held at student services until the end of the school day. Students who have had their phone confiscated will be able to collect their phone at 3.15pm from student services.

We would like to thank all parents for your continued support from home to ensure we maintain these standards.



### **CAFOD RE Sessions**

We were delighted to welcome members of CAFOD - the Catholic Agency for Overseas Development to school today to deliver sessions in our RE classes. Students discussed what Catholic Social Teaching is and were asked to complete an activity based on key principles such as the 'Common Good,' 'Participation' and 'Human Dignity' by deciding which applied in a variety of scenarios.


## **English Department celebrate our Remembrance Theme**

















#### The Soldier

### **Year 11 Tassomai Rewards Scheme**

This half term we have launched our Tassomai rewards scheme for students in **Year 11**.



#### What is Tassomai?

Tassomai is an online learning tool that helps students to study and revise. Our Year 11 students and parents have access to the platform to support their revision through the school's subscription and allows students to identify their strongest topics, as well as those areas where they require more support. Personalised links to relevant learning resources will be displayed, as well as live statistics on their average accuracy and how many days they have been active on the program.

## How do I earn my rewards?

<u>Simply log in and start revising!</u> We will be tracking the number of questions answered through the platform on each account via the online dashboard. Those who answer the most questions will gain a reward!





#### What is the reward?

Students who have answered the highest number of questions will win £20 gift voucher each half term! By using Tassomai regularly you will also build a bank of data to highlight areas of strengths and weaknesses that will support your revision and learning and prepare you for success in the summer examinations.

We encourage our Notre Dame Parents and Families of students with SEND to come along, have a cuppa and ask any questions to the expert teams available.



## Message from Liverpool City Council: Be Bright Be Seen





Dear Pupils, Staff, Parents/Guardians

British Summertime ended last weekend - the clocks have gone back by an hour with most of us travelling in the dark. As a road user there are things you can do to help yourself making sure that other road users can see you.

#### **Pedestrians**

• Wear something brightly coloured in the day & reflective at night. Such as fluorescent & reflective arm bands or bag or rucksack with high vis strips etc.

Keep to the footpath and well-lit areas, if possible, be aware of your surroundings, take out earphones and put phones in your pockets so you are not distracted and be aware of other road users who may not be as visible especially when crossing the roads.

#### Cyclists

- At night your bike must have white front and red rear light lit & fitted with a red rear reflector,
- Front and spoke reflectors are useful to help other road users see you.
- Wear bright and if possible reflective clothing to be more visible to other road users and have no distractions.

#### Car Drivers

- Regularly check that all your lights are in working order.
- Try to keep the car clean so that it reflects light and makes it easier to see, paying particular attention to lights, windows, and mirrors.
- Carry a high visibility vest or jacket or torch if you need to get out in the dark due to a breakdown so you are visible to other drivers.
- Remember to be aware of the more vulnerable road user who may be hard to see and drive at the appropriate speed for the environment
- No distractions whilst driving.

## Safeguarding Update - Nitrous Oxide (Laughing Gas)

The government has made the possession of Nitrous Oxide (Laughing Gas) a criminal offence in England and Wales.





Its use soared during the pandemic, becoming one of the most-abused substances, especially by 16 to 24-year-olds. The ban was designed to tackle <u>anti-social behaviour</u>. Further information about what Nitrous Oxide is and why it has been banned can **be found here.**
